

GETTING AROUND MONTREAL <<

PUBLIC TRANSIT >> SOCIÉTÉ DE TRANSPORT DE MONTRÉAL (STM)

Public transit is an excellent way to visit the city – safe, affordable, reliable, and accessible. Three of the four metro lines link downtown to major tourist sites, as do numerous bus lines and commuter trains. Metro hours are Monday to Friday and Sunday, 5:30 a.m. to 1 a.m. and Saturday, 5:30 a.m. to 1:30 a.m. Trains come on average every eight minutes and every three minutes during rush hours.

NEW! With the 747 shuttle bus, you can travel to and from the Montréal-Trudeau airport and downtown Montreal. This service is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The cost of this express service is \$10, payable in cash in the bus – coins only, no bills. The fee includes a pass valid for 24 consecutive hours in the STM's bus and Metro network.

BY BICYCLE >> BIXI

Montreal is a green geo-tourist city, and the first city in the world recognized by the National Geographic Society. The city features 350 kilometres of bike paths.

BIXI is Montreal's self-serve bike system – a great way of getting around the city. Accessible to everyone 24 hours a day, seven days a week, from May to November. Grab one at a BIXI station when you need it and leave it at any other station when you get where you want to go. Why not visit Le Mois de la Photo à Montréal exhibitions by BIXI?

BY CAR >> CAR2GO

Wherever you are, there's a car2go. You can take any of the car2gos you find distributed around the spot or book online 30 minutes before you want to drive. That way you can save yourself the wait and get to your destination faster. At your destination you can either leave the vehicle, or go back to it if you want to drive further.

BY TRAIN - VIARAIL

The train company VIA Rail Canada links more than 450 Canadian cities and towns.

BUS - ORLEANS EXPRES

A number of American and Canadian bus companies, including Orleans Express, stop in Montreal. The Central Station is located downtown and is accessible by Metro from the Berri-UQAM station.

BY CAR OR BY TRAIN

If you are planning to travel by car, Montreal is accessible by road from everywhere in Canada and the United States (the island of Montreal is only 75 kilometres from the U.S. border).

BY PLANE

If you are travelling by plane, the Montréal-Trudeau airport is just 20 minutes from downtown. About forty airlines land at the airport, including direct flights from 130 destinations (regular and seasonal) in Canada, the United States, and overseas.
